Please read before Pre-Enrollment & Course Add/Drop

A) Year 4 and Graduating Students must do the Self-Graduation Check before pre-enrollment and course add/drop.

Please download the study plan in FBA Homepage and perform the relative checking from time to time (https://fba.umac.mo/students/study-plans/). Please ensure you have taken <u>all required</u> courses for graduation in your last year of study.

If you have NOT taken and passed all required courses in your curriculum, you will NOT be able to graduate. In addition, a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 is required for graduation.

B) Quotas for compulsory courses and major / required electives

Please check your enrollment plan at the FBA homepage (https://fba.umac.mo/students/study-plans/) before pre-enrollment and course add/drop to ensure you enroll in the correct courses. Please make sure you have enrolled into all your compulsory courses and major/required electives.

C) Taking more than 20 credit units

NO FBA STUDENT WILL BE ALLOWED TO TAKE EIGHT 3-CREDIT COURSES.

D) Courses / Major information

ACCOUNTING (ACCT) COURSES / MAJOR:

- ACCT2000 Management Accounting I and ACCT2002 Principles of Managerial Accounting are incompatible. Only 3 credit units will be awarded if students complete the said two courses. ACCT2002 will NOT be offered starting from academic year 2018/2019, students who fail to take ACCT2002 will need to take ACCT2000 instead.
- 2. The pre-requisite requirement of courses below are revised starting from academic year 2017/2018.

- 3. ACCT3006/3007 Internship for Accounting Function I/II, carry 1.50 credit units each course, are two consecutive semester required electives for ACC17-PAC17 students (B7 or after intakes). These courses CANNOT be counted as free electives for B6 or before intakes. Students intend to take these courses should submit the completed "Internship Acceptance Form" on semester basis and obtain approval from the course instructor concerned before enrollment. Students should drop this course during the course add/drop period if they are UNABLE to find any internship successfully.
- 4. Graduates of the Bachelor of Science in Accounting (ACC) programme are awarded numbers of paper exemptions by Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA) and CPA Australia, provided that the corresponding UM courses are completed. Please refer to FBA webpage for details (https://fba.umac.mo/programmes/bachelor/bscacc/).
- 5. Students should follow the study plan in accordance with their major and intake. <u>NOT all ACCT courses are offered every semester</u>. If students do not take courses in the right sequence, they may <u>NOT</u> graduate on time. For the study plans, please refer to the FBA homepage (https://fba.umac.mo/students/study-plans/).

BUSINESS ECONOMICS (BECO) COURSES / MAJOR:

- Students are NOT allowed to take BECO1000 Principles of Microeconomics and BECO1001
 Principles of Macroeconomics at the same time.
- Students MUST take BECO1000 Principles of Microeconomics before they can take BECO1001 Principles of Macroeconomics.



- BECO2000 Intermediate Economics is for FNC and FNM students only, and NO exchange student is allowed to take this course.
- 4. BECO2001 Econometrics I is for FNC and FNM students only, and NO exchange student is allowed to take this course.
- 5. BECO4003 Introduction to Econometrics is for BEC and BEC-SEC students only, and NO exchange student is allowed to take this course.
- 6. BECO4004 Applied Econometrics is for BEC and BEC-SEC students only, and NO exchange student is allowed to take this course.
- 7. **IMPORTANT**: If a course is <u>offered in the 1st semester</u>, normally it <u>will NOT</u> be offered in the 2nd <u>semester</u> anymore with the exception of BECO1000 and BECO1001. A course will <u>NOT</u> be <u>re-offered in the 2nd semester</u> even if students need the course to graduate.
- 8. BEC and BEC-SEC students should carefully perform the graduation check before pre-enrollment and add/drop period to ensure that you are able to complete all the required courses for gradation.

- Courses from old programme (A8 or before intake) are not offered starting from academic year 2012/2013. Students from the old programme can refer to the *List of Equivalent Courses* from Registry Homepage (https://reg.umac.mo/current-students/course-enrolment/generalinfo/), or check with FBA General Office.
- FINC2000 Financial Management and FINC2001 Advanced Financial Management are NOT for FNC16 and FNC17 students (B6 or after intakes), they should take FINC2003 Corporate Finance instead.
- 4. FINC2003 Corporate Finance is **NOT** for FNC11 students (B5 or before intakes), they should take FINC2000 Financial Management instead.
- 5. FINC4009 Financial Modeling is for FNC and FNM students only, and NO exchange student is allowed to take this course.
- 6. FINC4011 Applied Financial Project is for FNC students only, and NO exchange student is allowed to take this course.
- 7. FINC4011 Applied Financial Project is a two-semester course. Year 4 students should ensure that you have enrolled this course at the 1st semester of academic year 2018/2019. If you have not taken the course in the 1st semester, your graduation will be delayed.
- 8. Students should carefully perform the graduation check before pre-enrollment and course add/drop period to ensure that you are able to complete all the required courses for gradation.
- 9. Students who would like to go on overseas exchange programme should go in their 2nd or 3rd year of study. You **MUST** stay in UM to complete the one-year applied research project (i.e. FINC4011 Applied Financial Project) in your 4th year of study.
- 10. **IMPORTANT**: If a course is <u>offered in the 2nd semester</u>, normally it <u>will **NOT** be offered in the 1st semester of next academic year. A course will <u>NOT</u> be re-offered in the 1st semester of the next academic year even if students need the course to graduate.</u>

INTERNATIONAL INTEGRATED RESORT MANAGEMENT (IIRM) COURSES / MAJOR:

- 25 quotas of IIRM1000 Introduction to Integrated Resort Management will be offered to B8 students in the 1st semester of academic year 2018/2019, the rest of B8 students will take it in the 2nd semester.
- 2. IIRM4007 Hospitality Management Project will be offered in the 1st semester of academic year 2018/2019 instead of the 2nd semester.
- 3. PSYC1000 Introduction to Psychology is a compulsory course for IIR17 students (B7 or after intakes). IIR17 students (B8 or after intakes) are NOT allowed to take GESB1010 Psychology of Everyday Life as General Education (GE) course or free elective (FE).
- 4. IIRM4000 Strategic Management for the Resort and Gaming Industries will be offered in the 1st semester of academic year 2018/2019 instead of the 2nd semester.



- 5. HGM11 students (B3 to B6 intakes) need to take **non-FBA electives** to fulfil the graduation requirement. Please refer to related study plan for details.

GLOBAL BUSINESS MANAGEMENT (MGMT) COURSES / MAJOR:

- MGMT3000 Global Business Environment is offered to students from GBS15, GBM11, MKG11 and MKG11-RSM11 (B6 intake) and all retaking students in this semester. Students from HRM11 and FIC15 will take this course in the 2nd semester.
- 2. MGMT3001 International Management is offered to GBM11 and HRM11 students (B5 intake) in the 1st semester, and this course will NOT be offered in the 2nd semester.



- MGMT4002 Asian Business is offered to GBM11 students (B5 intake), and this course will NOT be offered in the 2nd semester.
- 4. MGMT4003 and MGMT4004 are **ONLY** offered in the 1st semester.
- 5. GBM11 students (B5 intake) are required to take **two** major electives totally in order to fulfill their graduation requirement. Please refer to FBA homepage for more information (https://fba.umac.mo/students/study-plans/).

MANAGEMENT (MGMT) COURSES / MAJOR:

- MGMT1000 Principles of Management is offered for students from ACC17, FNC17 and IIR17 (B8 intake), and all retaking students only.
- 2. MGMT2000 Business Communications is offered to GBS17 students (B7 intake) and all retaking students only. Students from other majors will take this course in the 2nd semester.
- MGMT2001 Organization Behavior is offered to GBS17 students (B7 intake) in both 1st and 2nd semesters. Students who take MGMT2001 in the 1st semester will take ISOM2001 in the 2nd semester, and vice versa.
- 4. MGMT3003 Strategic Management is ONLY offered to students from ACC15-PAC15, ACC15-AIS15 (B5 intake), FIC15, GBM11, MKG11 and MKG11-RSM11 (B6 intake) in the 1st semester, students from other majors will take this course in the 2nd semester.
- 5. MGMT3004 Research Methods is offered to HRM11 students (B6 intake) in the 1st semester of academic year 2018/2019. Students (B6 intake) from other majors will take this course in the 2nd semester.
- 6. MGMT3005 Human Resource Management is offered to students from FIC15 (B5 intake), HRM11, HGM11-CHM11 and HGM11-GMM11 (B6 intake).



- 7. MGMT4009 (for B6-intake HRM11) and MGMT4010 (for B5-intake HRM11) are only offered in the 1st semester, and both courses will NOT be offered in the 2nd semester.
- 8. HRM11 students (B5 intake) are required to take **three** major electives totally in order to fulfill their graduation requirement. Please refer to FBA homepage for more information (https://fba.umac.mo/students/study-plans/).

- MKTG2000 Principles of Marketing is offered to GBS17 students (B7 intake) and all retaking students. Students from ACC17, FNC17 and IIR17 (B7 intake) will take this course in the 2nd semester.
- 2. MKTG3000 Consumer Behavior, MKTG4001 Integrated Marketing Communications, and MKTG4002 Marketing Strategy will **NOT** be offered in the 2nd semester. All MKG11 and MKG11-RSM11 students (B1 to B6 intakes) should enroll in these courses in the 1st semester.
- 3. MKTG4000 International Marketing is offered to GBM11 students (B6 intake) in the 1st semester. MKG11 and MKG11-RSM11 students (B6 intake) can take this course in the 2nd semester.
- 4. MKG11 and MKG11-RSM11 students (B5 intake) need to take **three** major electives to fulfill the graduation requirement. Please refer to the FBA homepage for more details (https://fba.umac.mo/students/study-plans/).
- 5. In order not to delay your graduation, students should (a) finish all major compulsory courses by the 1st semester of the fourth year of study; and (b) follow the study plan in FBA homepage by taking the major electives in each semester.

- ◆ FBA students (B1 to B6 intakes) and IIR17 students (B7 or after intakes) are required to take PSYC1000 Introduction to Psychology. These students are NOT allowed to take GESB1010 Psychology of Everyday Life to fulfil either the GE or FE requirement.

DISTRIBUTION/DIVERSITY (DE) COURSES:

- ♦ Students admitted between academic years 2011/2012 and 2016/2017 (B1 to B6 intakes) have to take DE courses in order to satisfy their curriculum. The four DE courses should be from four different major programmes/disciplines other than the student's own major programme. For the disciplines of each FBA major programme, you can refer to the FBA website for your reference (https://fba.umac.mo/students/study-plans/).

- ♦ HGM11-CHM11 students (B1 to B6 intakes) have to take IIRM3014 Hospitality and Tourism Law as one of their DE courses, thus other course(s) with discipline in "Law" will not be classified as their DE course(s).
- ♦ HGM11-GMM11 students (B1 to B6 intakes) should take IIRM3012 Gaming Law and IIRM2001



Psychology of Gambling as their DE courses, thus other course(s) with disciplines in "Law" and "Psychology" will not be classified as their DE course(s).

▶ Students (B2 to B5 intakes) who are placed in level zero English language courses are required to enroll in any pair of co-requisite courses in their 1st year of study. Completion of a pair of co-requisite courses is a must for graduation of this group of students (i.e. B2 to B5 intakes who are placed in level zero English language courses). The course discipline of these four courses is "English Language", completed co-requisite courses may be classified as DE or FE courses, depending on the student's enrolment record. Students will only be eligible to take the intermediate level English language courses after they have completed the level-zero English language courses.
