Please read before Pre-Enrollment & Course Add/Drop

A) Year 4 and Graduating Students must do the Self-Graduation Check before pre-enrollment and course add/drop.

Please download the study plan in FBA Homepage and perform the relative checking from time to time (https://fba.um.edu.mo/students/study-plans/). Please ensure you have taken <u>all required</u> <u>courses</u> for graduation in your last year of study.

If you have **NOT** taken and passed all required courses in your curriculum, you will **NOT** be able to graduate. In addition, a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 is required for graduation.

B) Quotas for compulsory courses and major/required electives

Please check your study plan at the FBA homepage (https://fba.um.edu.mo/students/study-plans/) before pre-enrollment and course add/drop to ensure you have enrolled in the correct courses. Please make sure you have enrolled into all your compulsory courses and major/required electives.

C) Study load

NO FBA STUDENT WILL BE ALLOWED TO TAKE **EIGHT 3-CREDIT COURSES**.

D) Course/Major information

ACCOUNTING (ACCT) COURSES / MAJOR:

- ACCT2000 Management Accounting I and ACCT2002 Principles of Managerial Accounting are incompatible. Only 3 credit units will be awarded if students complete the said two courses. ACCT2002 has been phased out since academic year 2018/2019, students who fail to take ACCT2002 will need to take ACCT2000 instead.
- 2. The pre-requisite requirement of courses below are revised starting from academic year 2017/2018.

- 3. ACCT3006/3007 Internship for Accounting Function I/II, which carry 1.50 credit units each course, are two consecutive semester required electives for ACC17-PAC17 students (B7 and B8 intakes). These courses CANNOT be counted as free electives for B6 and before intakes. Students intend to take these courses should submit the completed "Internship Acceptance Form" on semester basis and obtain approval from the course instructor concerned before enrollment. Students should drop this course during the course add/drop period if they are UNABLE to find any internship successfully.
- 4. Graduates of the Bachelor of Science in Accounting (ACC) programme are awarded numbers of paper exemptions by Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA) and CPA Australia, provided that the corresponding UM courses are completed. Please refer to FBA webpage for details (https://fba.um.edu.mo/programmes/bachelor/bscacc/).
- Students should follow the study plan in accordance with their major and intake. <u>NOT all ACCT</u> <u>courses are offered every semester</u>. If students do not take courses in the right sequence, they may NOT graduate on time. For the study plans, please refer to the FBA homepage (https://fba.um.edu.mo/students/study-plans/).

BUSINESS ECONOMICS (BECO) COURSES / MAJOR:

- 1. Students are **NOT** allowed to take BECO1000 Principles of Microeconomics and BECO1001 Principles of Macroeconomics at the same time.
- 2. Students **MUST** take BECO1000 Principles of Microeconomics before they can take BECO1001 Principles of Macroeconomics.



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- 3. BECO2000 Intermediate Economics is for FNC and FNM students only, and **NO** exchange student is allowed to take this course.
- 4. BECO2001 Econometrics I is for FNC and FNM students only, and **NO** exchange student is allowed to take this course.
- 5. BECO3009 Intermediate Macroeconomics is for BEC and BEC-SEC students only, and **NO** exchange student is allowed to take this course.
- 6. BECO4003 Introduction to Econometrics is for BEC and BEC-SEC students only, and **NO** exchange student is allowed to take this course.
- 7. BECO4004 Applied Econometrics is for BEC and BEC-SEC students only, and **NO** exchange student is allowed to take this course.
- 8. BECO4007 History of Economic Thought is for BEC and BEC-SEC students only, and **NO** exchange student is allowed to take this course.
- 9. IMPORTANT: If a course is <u>offered in the 2nd semester</u>, normally it <u>will NOT be offered in the 1st semester</u> of next academic year anymore with the exception of BECO1000 and BECO1001. A course will <u>NOT be re-offered in the next semester</u> even if students need the course to graduate.
- 10. BEC and BEC-SEC students should carefully perform graduation check before pre-enrollment and course add/drop period to ensure that you are able to complete all the required courses for gradation.

FINANCE (FINC) COURSES / MAJOR:

- Courses from old programme (A8 and before intake) had not been offered since academic year 2012/2013. Students from the old programme can refer to the *List of Equivalent Courses* from Registry Homepage (https://reg.um.edu.mo/current-students/course-enrolment/generalinfo/), or check with FBA General Office.
- FINC2000 Financial Management and FINC2001 Advanced Financial Management are NOT for FNC16, FNC17 and FNC19 students (B6 and after intakes), they should take FINC2003 Corporate Finance instead.
- 4. FINC2003 Corporate Finance is for FNC16, FNC17 and FNC19 students (B6 and after intakes) only. FNC11 students (B5 and before intakes) should take FINC2000 Financial Management instead.
- 5. FINC4009 Financial Modeling is for FNC and FNM students only, and **NO** exchange student is allowed to take this course.
- 6. FINC4011 Applied Financial Project is for FNC students only, and **NO** exchange student is allowed to take this course.
- 7. FINC4011 Applied Financial Project is a two-semester course. Year-4 students should ensure that you have enrolled this course at the 1st semester of academic year 2019/2020. If you have not taken the course in the 1st semester, your graduation will be delayed.
- 8. Students should carefully perform graduation check before pre-enrollment and course add/drop period to ensure that you are able to complete all the required courses for gradation.
- Students who would like to go on overseas exchange programme should go in their 2nd or 3rd year of study. You **MUST** stay in UM to complete the one-year applied research project (i.e. FINC4011 Applied Financial Project) in your 4th year of study.
- IMPORTANT: If a course is <u>offered in the 2nd semester</u>, normally it <u>will NOT</u> be offered in the 1st <u>semester</u> of the next academic year. A course will <u>NOT</u> be re-offered in the 1st semester of the next academic year even if students need the course to graduate.

INTERNATIONAL INTEGRATED RESORT MANAGEMENT (IRTM) COURSES / MAJOR:

- Prefix "IIRM" will be updated to "IRTM" for all IIRM courses starting from academic year 2019/2020. Courses with prefixes "IIRM" and "IRTM" are equivalent. For example, IRTM1000 is equivalent to IIRM1000.
- 2. PSYC1000 Introduction to Psychology is a compulsory course for IIR17 students (B7 and



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B8 intakes). IIR17 students are **NOT** allowed to take GESB1010 Psychology of Everyday Life as General Education (GE) course or free elective (FE).

- IIR17 students (B7 and B8 intakes) who have not enrolled PSYC1000 should take the course in the 1st semester of academic year 2019/2020.
- 4. IRTM2001 Psychology of Gambling will be offered in the 1st semester of academic year 2019/2020.
- 5. IRTM3002 Convention and Exhibition Management will be offered in the 1st semester of academic year 2019/2020, all CHM17 students (B7 and B8 intakes) **MUST** enroll this course.
- 6. IRTM3017 Accommodation, Facilities and Security Management will offered in 1st semester of academic year 2020/2021.
- 7. IRTM4005 Gaming Management Project and IRTM4007 Hospitality Management Project will be offered in the 2nd semester of academic year 2019/2020 as a joint-course.
- 8. IRTM4009 Special Topics in Hotel and Resort Management will be offered in both 1st semester and 2nd semester of academic year 2019/2020. The 1st semester will be taught by Dr. Yeongbae CHOE (YChoe@um.edu.mo), whereas the 2nd semester will be taught by Dr. Jacey CHOE (JaceyChoe@um.edu.mo). For further information, please contact both professors directly.
- 9. Summer Term of IIR17 (B7 and B8 intakes) is **CANCELLED**.
- HGM11 students (B3 to B6 intakes) need to take **non-FBA electives** to fulfil the graduation requirement. Please refer to related study plans (https://fba.um.edu.mo/students/study-plans/) for details.

- 1. MGMT1000 Principles of Management is offered to ACC19, FNC19 and IIR19 students (B9 intake), and all retaking students only.
- 2. MGMT2000 Business Communications is offered to GBS17 students (B8 intake), as well as all retaking students only.
- 3. Students who take MGMT2001 Organizational Behavior in the 1st semester will take ISOM2001 Information Systems and Organization in the 2nd semester, and vice versa.
- 4. MGMT3003 Strategic Management is offered to students from ACC15-PAC15 and ACC15-AIS15 (B6 intake), students from FIC17, GBM17, MKG17 and MKG17-RSM17 (B7 intake), as well as all retaking students.
- 5. MGMT3004 Research Methods is offered to GBM17 and HRM17 students (B7 intake), as well as all retaking students.
- 6. MGMT3005 Human Resources Management is offered to HRM17 students (B7 intake), as well as all retaking students.
- 7. MGMT3009 Business Ethics and Corporate Social Responsibility is offered BEC17, BEC17-SEC17 and HRM17 students (B7 intake).
- 8. MGMT4009 Training and Development and is offered to HRM17 students (B7 intake), as well as all retaking students.
- 9. MGMT4010 Performance and Compensation Management is offered to HRM11 students (B6 intake), as well as all retaking students.

- 3. MKTG4001 Integrated Marketing Communication and MKTG4002 Marketing Strategy are offered to MKG11 and MKG11-RSM11 students (B6 intake), as well as all retaking students.
- 4. MKG11 and MKG11-RSM11 students (B6 intake) need to take **three** major electives to fulfill the graduation requirement. Please refer to the FBA homepage for more details (https://fba.um.edu.mo/students/study-plans/).
- 5. In order not to delay your graduation, students should (a) finish all major compulsory courses by the 1st semester of the fourth year of study; and (b) follow the study plan in FBA homepage by taking the major electives in each semester.

- FBA students (B1 to B6 intakes) and IIR17 students (B7 and B8 intakes) are required to take PSYC1000 Introduction to Psychology. These students are **NOT** allowed to take GESB1010 Psychology of Everyday Life to fulfil either the GE or FE requirement.

DISTRIBUTION/DIVERSITY (DE) COURSES:

- Students admitted between academic years 2011/2012 and 2016/2017 (B1 to B6 intakes) have to take DE courses in order to satisfy their curriculum. The four DE courses should be from four different major programmes/disciplines other than the student's own major programme. For the disciplines of each FBA major programme, you can refer to the FBA website for your reference (https://fba.um.edu.mo/students/study-plans/).
