Please read before Pre-Enrollment & Course Add/Drop

A) Year 4 and Graduating Students must do the Self-Graduation Check before pre-enrollment and course add/drop.

Please download the study plan in FBA Homepage and perform the relative checking from time to time (https://fba.um.edu.mo/students/study-plans/). Please ensure you have taken <u>all required</u> courses for graduation in your last year of study.

If you have NOT taken and passed all required courses in your curriculum, you will NOT be able to graduate. In addition, a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 is required for graduation.

B) Quotas for compulsory courses and major/required electives

Please check your study plan at the FBA homepage (https://fba.um.edu.mo/students/study-plans/) before pre-enrollment and course add/drop to ensure you have enrolled in the correct courses. Please make sure you have enrolled into all your compulsory courses and major/required electives.

C) Study load

NO FBA STUDENT WILL BE ALLOWED TO TAKE EIGHT 3-CREDIT COURSES.

D) Course/Major information

ACCOUNTING (ACCT) COURSES / MAJOR:

- ACCT2000 Management Accounting I and ACCT2002 Principles of Managerial Accounting are incompatible. Only 3 credit units will be awarded if students complete the said two courses. ACCT2002 has been phased out since academic year 2018/2019, students who fail to take ACCT2002 will need to take ACCT2000 instead.
- 2. ACCT2001 may **NOT** be offered in the first semester of AY2022/2023.
- 3. ACCT3000 may **NOT** be offered in the second semester of AY2022/2023.
- 4. Due to the new programme implementation, ACCT3001 may **NOT** be offered in AY2023/2024.

- 6. ACCT3006/3007 Internship for Accounting Function I/II, which carry 1.50 credit units each course, are paired required electives for ACC17-PAC17, ACC19 and ACC21 students (B7 and after intakes). These courses CAN be counted as free electives for B6 and before intakes. Students intend to take these courses should submit the completed "Internship Acceptance Form" on semester basis and obtain approval from the course instructor concerned before enrollment. Students should drop this course during the course add/drop period if they are UNABLE to find any internship successfully.
- 7. Graduates of the Bachelor of Science in Accounting (ACC) programme are eligible for paper exemptions by Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA), Chartered Institute of Management Accountants (CIMA), CPA Australia, provided that the corresponding UM courses are completed. Please refer to FBA webpage for details (https://fba.um.edu.mo/programmes/bachelor/bscacc/).
- Students should follow the study plan in accordance with their major and intake. <u>NOT all ACCT</u> courses are offered every semester. If students do not take courses in the right sequence, they may <u>NOT</u> graduate on time. For the study plans, please refer to the FBA homepage (https://fba.um.edu.mo/students/study-plans/).



BUSINESS ECONOMICS (BECO) COURSES / MAJOR:

- 1. Students are **NOT** allowed to take BECO1000 Principles of Microeconomics and BECO1001 Principles of Macroeconomics at the same time.
- Students MUST take BECO1000 Principles of Microeconomics before they can take BECO1001 Principles of Macroeconomics.
- 3. BECO2000 Intermediate Economics is for FNC, FNE and FNM students only, and NO exchange student is allowed to take this course.
- 4. BECO2001 Econometrics I is for FNC, FNE and FNM students only, and NO exchange student is allowed to take this course.
- BECO3008 Intermediate Microeconomics is for BEC and BEC-SEC students only, and NO exchange student is allowed to take this course.
- BECO4003 Introduction to Econometrics is for BEC and BEC-SEC students only, and NO
 exchange student is allowed to take this course.
- 7. BECO4004 Applied Econometrics will be offered in the 2nd semester of academic year 2022/2023.
- 8. <u>BECO4005 Applied Economics for Leisure Industries will only be offered in the first semester</u> but not the 2nd semester of academic year 2022/2023.
- 9. IMPORTANT: If a course is offered in the 1st semester, normally it will NOT be offered in the 2nd semester of next academic year anymore with the exception of BECO1000 and BECO1001. A course will NOT be re-offered in the next semester even if students need the course to graduate.
- 10. BEC and BEC-SEC students should carefully perform graduation check before pre-enrollment and course add/drop period to ensure that you are able to complete all the required courses for gradation.

- Courses from old programme (A8 and before intake) had not been offered since academic year 2012/2013. - FINC2000 Financial Management and FINC2001 Advanced Financial Management are NOT for FNC16, FNC17 and FNC20 students (B6 and after intakes), they should take FINC2003 Corporate Finance instead.
- 4. FINC2003 Corporate Finance is for FNC16, FNC17 and FNC20 students (B6 and after intakes) only. FNC11 students (B5 and before intakes) should take FINC2000 Financial Management instead.
- 5. <u>FINC4008 International Finance and Global Issues will only be offered in the first semester but not the 2nd semester of academic year 2022/2023.</u>
- 6. FINC4009 Financial Modeling is for FNC and FNM students only, and NO exchange student is allowed to take this course.
- 7. FINC4011 Applied Financial Project is for FNC students only, and NO exchange student is allowed to take this course.
- 8. FINC4011 Applied Financial Project is a two-semester course. Year-4 students should ensure that you have enrolled this course at the 1st semester of academic year 2022/2023. If you have not taken the course in the 1st semester, your graduation will be delayed.
- FINC4012 Financial Risk Management is for FNC, FNE and FNM students only, and NO exchange student is allowed to take this course.
- 10. Students should carefully perform graduation check before pre-enrollment and course add/drop period to ensure that you are able to complete all the required courses for gradation.
- 11. Students who would like to go on overseas exchange programme should go in their 2nd or 3rd year of study. You **MUST** stay in UM to complete the one-year applied research project (i.e. FINC4011 Applied Financial Project) in your 4th year of study.
- 12. **IMPORTANT**: If a course is offered in the 1st semester, normally it will **NOT** be offered in the 2nd



<u>semester</u> of the next academic year. A course will <u>NOT</u> be re-offered in the next semester even if students need the course to graduate.

INTERNATIONAL INTEGRATED RESORT MANAGEMENT (IRTM) COURSES / MAJOR:

- 1. Prefix "IRM" has be updated to "IRTM" for all IIRM courses starting from academic year 2019/2020. Courses with prefixes "IRM" and "IRTM" are equivalent. For example, IRTM1000 is equivalent to IIRM1000.
- PSYC1000 Introduction to Psychology is a compulsory course for IIR17 students (B7, B8 and part of B9 intakes). IIR17 students are NOT allowed to take GESB1010 Psychology of Everyday Life as General Education (GE) course or free elective (FE); In addition, if the students have already completed PSYC1000, they are NOT allowed to take GESB1010 as GE or FE course.
- IIR students (B9 intakes) MUST enroll the courses according to the corresponding study plan (IIR17 – original curriculum or IIR20 – 2020/2021 curriculum). Please refer to related study plans (https://fba.um.edu.mo/students/study-plans/) for details.
- 4. **IIR20 students** MUST enroll **ONE** RE course from "Common Required Electives List" and **ONE** RE course from "Convention & Hospitality Management Required Electives List" (for CHM20) OR "Gaming Management Required Electives List" (for GMM20). Please refer to study plans (https://fba.um.edu.mo/students/study-plans/) for details.
- 5. The following courses will **ONLY** be offered in the 1st semester of academic year 2022/2023.
 - IRTM3003 Casino Management
 - IRTM3004 The Macao Gaming and Hospitality Industries
 - IRTM3006 Human Resource Management in Integrated Resort
 - IRTM3016 Casino Marketing
 - IRTM3017 Accommodation, Facilities and Security Management
 - IRTM3018 Casino Mathematics
 - IRTM4001 Resort Marketing and Promotion
- 6. HGM11 students (B3 to B6 intakes) need to take **non-FBA electives** to fulfil the graduation requirement. Please refer to related study plans (https://fba.um.edu.mo/students/study-plans/) for details.

INFORMATION SYSTEMS AND OPERATIONS MANAGEMENT (ISOM) COURSES:

- 1. QMDS102 Applied Calculus has phased out, HGM11-GMM11 students (B1 to B6 intakes) who fail to take QMDS102 will need to take ISOM1004 Applied Calculus instead.
- 2. ISOM1003 Logic and Reasoning has phased out, HGM11-GMM11 students (B1 to B6 intakes) who fail to



take ISOM1003 will need to take ISOM3030 Quantitative Decision Analysis.

- 3. ISOM2000 Business Programming and ISOM3029 Computer Programming Using C++ are equivalent courses. ISOM2000 has been phased out since academic year 2019/2020; students who fail to take ISOM2000 will need to take ISOM3029 instead.
- 4. ISOM2004 will **NOT** be offered in the near future, HGM11-GMM11 students (B1 to B6 intakes) who fail to take ISOM2004 will need to take ISOM2002 instead.
- 5. ISOM3018 Business Data Mining and Visualization is compulsory course for BIA students and they are NOT allowed to take ISOM3006 Big Data with Business Applications due to course similarity. Both ISOM3006 and ISOM3018 are NOT for FST students to take.
- 6. ISOM4003 Implementation of Accounting Information Systems is a <u>final year level course</u>. Students who do not have knowledge of database management, networking and communication, as well as systems analysis and design are <u>NOT</u> recommended to take this course.
- ISOM3004 E-Accounting and Financial Modeling, ISOM3006 Big Data with Business Applications and ISOM4002 Web-based Development of Information Systems will not be offered in 2022/2023 academic year.

- ◆ FBA students (B1 to B6 intakes) and IIR17 students (B7 and B8 intakes) are required to take PSYC1000 Introduction to Psychology. These students are NOT allowed to take GESB1010 Psychology of Everyday Life to fulfil either the GE or FE requirement.

- ◆ Students admitted between academic years 2011/2012 and 2016/2017 (B1 to B6 intakes) have to take DE courses in order to satisfy their curriculum. The four DE courses should be from four different major programmes/disciplines other than the student's own major programme. - ◆ Students majoring in ACC11, ACC13-PAC13, ACC13-AIS13, ACC15-PAC15, ACC15-AIS15, FNC11, FNC11-BKG11, FNC11-CFN11, FNC11-FNE11, FNC11-IMT11, FNC16, FNC16-FNE16, GBS11, GBS15, BEC11, BEC15, BEC11-SEC11, BEC15-SEC15, ELB11, FIC11, FIC15, GBM11, HRM11, MKG11 and MKG11-RSM11 (B1 to B6 intakes) are required to take ACCT2003 Business Law as one of their DE courses, thus other course(s) with discipline in "Law" will not be classified as their DE course(s).
- ♦ HGM11-CHM11 students (B1 to B6 intakes) have to take IRTM3014 Hospitality and Tourism Law as one of their DE courses, thus other course(s) with discipline in "Law" will not be classified as their DE course(s).
- ◆ HGM11-GMM11 students (B1 to B6 intakes) should take IRTM3012 Gaming Law and IRTM2001 Psychology of Gambling as their DE courses, thus other course(s) with disciplines in "Law" and "Psychology" will not be classified as their DE course(s).

- ♦ In order to graduate, it is COMPULSORY for GBM17, GBM20 and GBM22 students to participate in the outgoing exchange programme for AT LEAST one semester.
