Please read before Pre-Enrollment & Course Add/Drop

A) Year 4 and Graduating Students must do the Self-Graduation Check before pre-enrollment and course add/drop.

Please download the study plan in FBA Homepage and perform the relative checking from time to time (<https://fba.um.edu.mo/students/study-plans/>). Please ensure you have taken **all required courses** for graduation in your last year of study.

If you have NOT taken and passed all required courses in your curriculum, you will NOT be able to graduate. In addition, a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 is required for graduation.

B) Quotas for compulsory courses and major/required electives

Please check your study plan at the FBA homepage (<https://fba.um.edu.mo/students/study-plans/>) before pre-enrollment and course add/drop to ensure you have enrolled in the correct courses.

Please make sure you have enrolled into all your compulsory courses and major/required electives.

C) Study load

NO FBA STUDENT WILL BE ALLOWED TO TAKE EIGHT 3-CREDIT COURSES.

D) Course/Major information

ACCOUNTING (ACCT) COURSES / MAJOR:

1. ACCT2000 Management Accounting I and ACCT2002 Principles of Managerial Accounting are incompatible. Only 3 credit units will be awarded if students complete the said two courses. ACCT2002 has been phased out since academic year 2018/2019, students who fail to take ACCT2002 will need to take ACCT2000 instead.
2. Due to the new programme implementation, ACCT2001 will be **only** offered in the **2nd semester** until AY2023/2024 and may **NOT** be offered in AY2024/2025.
3. Due to the new programme implementation, ACCT3000 will be **only** offered in the **1st semester** until AY2024/2025 and may **NOT** be offered in AY 2025/2026.
4. Due to the new programme implementation, ACCT3001 may **NOT** be offered in AY2023/2024.
5. Due to the new programme implementation, ACCT3003 **only** offered in the **1st semester** of AY2022/2023 and may **NOT** be offered in AY2023/2024.



6. ACCT2004 Intermediate Accounting is **NOT** for ACC17 and ACC19 students (B9 and before intakes), they should take ACCT2001 Intermediate Accounting I, ACCT3000 Intermediate Accounting II and ACCT3003 Intermediate Accounting III instead.
7. The pre-requisite requirements of courses below are revised starting from academic year 2017/2018.

9. ACCT3006/3007 Internship for Accounting Function I/II, which carry 1.50 credit units each course, are paired required electives for ACC17-PAC17, ACC19 and ACC21 students (B7 and after intakes). These courses **CAN** be counted as free electives for B6 and before intakes. Students intend to take these courses should submit the completed “Internship Acceptance Form” on semester basis and obtain approval from the course instructor concerned before enrollment. Students **should drop this course during the course add/drop period if they are UNABLE to find any internship** successfully.



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10. Graduates of the Bachelor of Science in Accounting (ACC) programme are awarded numbers of paper exemptions by some international professional accountancy bodies, provided that the corresponding UM courses are completed. Please refer to FBA webpage for details (<https://fba.um.edu.mo/programmes/bachelor/bscacc/>).
11. Students should follow the study plan in accordance with their major and intake. **NOT all ACCT courses are offered every semester**. If students do not take courses in the right sequence, they may **NOT** graduate on time. For the study plans, please refer to the FBA homepage (<https://fba.um.edu.mo/students/study-plans/>).

BUSINESS ECONOMICS (BECO) COURSES / MAJOR:

1. Students are **NOT** allowed to take BECO1000 Principles of Microeconomics and BECO1001 Principles of Macroeconomics at the same time.
2. Students **MUST** take BECO1000 Principles of Microeconomics **before** they can take BECO1001 Principles of Macroeconomics.
3. BECO3006 Money and Banking is for Year 3 and Year 4 BEC and FNC students only, and **NO** exchange student is allowed to take this course.
4. BECO3011 Financial Econometrics is for Year 3 and Year 4 FNC and FNE students only, and **NO** exchange student is allowed to take this course.
5. BECO4004 Applied Econometrics is for BEC and BEC-SEC students only, and **NO** exchange student is allowed to take this course.
6. BECO4010 Economic Development in Asia Pacific for BEC and BEC-SEC students only, and **NO** exchange student is allowed to take this course.
7. BECO4014 International Banking is for FNC, FNE, BEC and BEC-SEC students only, and **NO** exchange student is allowed to take this course.
8. **IMPORTANT:** If a course is offered in the 2nd semester, normally it will **NOT** be offered in the 1st semester of next academic year anymore with the exception of BECO1000 and BECO1001. A course will **NOT** be re-offered in the next semester even if students need the course to graduate.
9. BEC and BEC-SEC students should carefully perform graduation check before pre-enrollment and course add/drop period to ensure that you are able to complete all the required courses for gradation.

2. Courses from old programme (A8 and before intakes) had not been offered since academic year 2012/2013. 3. FINC2000 Financial Management and FINC2001 Advanced Financial Management are **NOT** for FNC16, FNC17 and FNC20 students (B6 and after intakes), they should take FINC2003 Corporate Finance instead.
4. FINC3003 Financial Markets and Institutions is for ACC (C1 Intake and after) and FNC students only.
5. FINC4011 Applied Financial Project is a two-semester course for FNC students only. Year-4 students should ensure that you have enrolled this course at the 1st semester of academic year



- 2022/2023. If you have not taken the course in the 1st semester, your graduation will be delayed.
6. FINC4014 Exotic Options and Structured Products is for Year 4 FNC and FNE students only.
 7. Students should carefully perform graduation check before pre-enrollment and course add/drop period to ensure that you are able to complete all the required courses for graduation.
 8. Students who would like to go on overseas exchange programme should go in their 2nd or 3rd year of study. You **MUST** stay in UM to complete the one-year applied research project (i.e. FINC4011 Applied Financial Project) in your 4th year of study.
 9. **IMPORTANT:** If a course is offered in the 2nd semester, normally it will NOT be offered in the 1st semester of the next academic year. A course will **NOT** be re-offered in the 1st semester of the next academic year even if students need the course to graduate.

INTERNATIONAL INTEGRATED RESORT MANAGEMENT (IRTM) COURSES / MAJOR:

1. Prefix “IIRM” will be updated to “IRTM” for all IIRM courses starting from academic year 2019/2020. Courses with prefixes “IIRM” and “IRTM” are equivalent. For example, IRTM1000 is equivalent to IIRM1000.
2. PSYC1000 Introduction to Psychology is a compulsory course for IIR17 students (B7, B8 and part of B9 intakes). IIR17 students are **NOT** allowed to take GESB1010 Psychology of Everyday Life as General Education (GE) course or free elective (FE); In addition, if the students have already completed PSYC1000, they are **NOT** allowed to take GESB1010 as GE or FE course.
3. IIR students (B9 intakes) MUST enroll the courses according to the corresponding study plan (IIR17 – original curriculum or IIR20 – 2020/2021 curriculum). Please refer to related study plans (<https://fba.um.edu.mo/students/study-plans/>) for details.
4. IIR20 students MUST enroll **ONE** RE course from “Common Required Electives List” and **ONE** RE course from “Convention & Hospitality Management Required Electives List” (for CHM20) OR “Gaming Management Required Electives List” (for GMM20). Please refer to study plans (<https://fba.um.edu.mo/students/study-plans/>) for details.
5. IRTM2001 Psychology of Gambling and IRTM3002 Convention and Exhibition Management will be offered in the 2nd semester of academic year 2022/2023. Gaming Management (GMM) students and Convention & Hospitality Management (CHM) students shall enroll in the corresponding courses according to their respective study plans.
6. IRTM4002 Global Issues in Resort and Gaming Management will be offered for final year students in the 2nd semester of academic year 2022/2023.
7. HGM11 students (B3 to B6 intakes) need to take **non-FBA electives** to fulfil the graduation requirement. Please refer to related study plans (<https://fba.um.edu.mo/students/study-plans/>) for



details.

INFORMATION SYSTEMS AND OPERATIONS MANAGEMENT (ISOM) COURSES:

1. ISOM2000 Business Programming and ISOM3029 Computer Programming Using C++ are equivalent courses. ISOM2000 has been phased out since academic year 2019/2020; students who fail to take ISOM2000 will need to take ISOM3029 instead.
2. ISOM3018 Business Data Mining and Visualization is compulsory course for BIA students and they are NOT allowed to take ISOM3006 Big Data with Business Applications due to course similarity. Both ISOM3006 and ISOM3018 are NOT for FST students to take.
3. ISOM4003 Implementation of Accounting Information Systems is a final year level course. Students who do not have knowledge of database management, networking and communication, as well as systems analysis and design are **NOT** recommended to take this course.
4. The following courses will not be offered in 2022/2023 academic year:
 - a. ISOM3004 E-Accounting and Financial Modeling,
 - b. ISOM3006 Big Data with Business Application
 - c. ISOM3035 Operations Management
 - d. ISOM4002 Web-based Development of Information Systems

1. MGMT1000 Principles of Management is offered to GBS22 students (C2 intake), and all retaking students only.

3. Students who take ISOM2001 Information Systems and Organization in the 1st semester will take MGMT2001 Organizational Behavior in the 2nd semester, and vice versa.
4. MGMT3003 Strategic Management is offered to students from GBS20, BEC20 and HRM20 (C0 intake), as well as all retaking students.
5. MGMT3004 Research Methods is offered to students from GBS20, MKG20 (C0 intake), as well as all retaking students.
6. MGMT3005 Human Resource Management is offered to GBS20 (C0 intake) as RE, as well as all retaking students.
7. MGMT3006 Human Resources Planning and Staffing is offered to HRM20 students (C0 intake), as well as all retaking students.

- ◆ In order to satisfy the GE requirement, **students admitted between academic years 2011/2012 and 2016/2017 (B1 to B6 intakes)** are required to take **TWO** courses from **Area 1** and **ONE** course from **EACH of Area 2 to 13**. Additional GE course(s) taken will **ONLY** be counted as free elective(s). For further details, please refer to the GE course list of your own intake (<https://fba.um.edu.mo/students/study-plans/>).
- ◆ FBA students (B1 to B6 intakes) and IIR17 students (B7 and B8 intakes) are required to take PSYC1000 Introduction to Psychology. These students are **NOT** allowed to take GESB1010 Psychology of Everyday Life to fulfil either the GE or FE requirement.

DISTRIBUTION/DIVERSITY (DE) COURSES:

- ◆ Students **admitted between academic years 2011/2012 and 2016/2017 (B1 to B6 intakes)** have to take DE courses in order to satisfy their curriculum. The four DE courses should be from four different major programmes/disciplines other than the student's own major programme. For the disciplines of each FBA major programme, you can refer to the FBA website for your reference (<https://fba.um.edu.mo/students/study-plans/>).
- ◆ Please visit the Registry homepage (<https://reg.um.edu.mo/current-students/course-enrolment/generalinfo/>) for course disciplines.
- ◆ Students majoring in ACC11, ACC13-PAC13, ACC13-AIS13, ACC15-PAC15, ACC15-AIS15, FNC11, FNC11-BKG11, FNC11-CFN11, FNC11-FNE11, FNC11-IMT11, FNC16, FNC16-FNE16, GBS11, GBS15, BEC11, BEC15, BEC11-SEC11, BEC15-SEC15, ELB11, FIC11, FIC15, GBM11, HRM11, MKG11 and MKG11-RSM11 (B1 to B6 intakes) are required to take ACCT2003 Business Law as one of their DE courses, thus other course(s) with discipline in "Law" will not be classified as their DE course(s).
- ◆ HGM11-CHM11 students (B1 to B6 intakes) have to take IRTM3014 Hospitality and Tourism Law as one of their DE courses, thus other course(s) with discipline in "Law" will not be classified as their DE course(s).
- ◆ HGM11-GMM11 students (B1 to B6 intakes) should take IRTM3012 Gaming Law and IRTM2001 Psychology of Gambling as their DE courses, thus other course(s) with disciplines in "Law" and "Psychology" will not be classified as their DE course(s).
